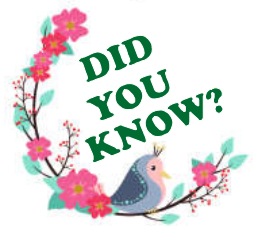

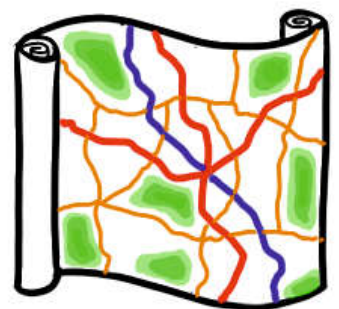

This will add some more colour for walkers who use the Greenway frequently. The event is being sponsored by ARCH and Letchworth Heritage Foundation. Thanks go to Ruth one of our volunteers, who has done most of the work in setting this up.



We are just waiting for the weather to improve a little bit before we start our volunteer events at the Wynd and in the In Bloom garden at Standalone Farm. Some work has already been done in the gardens over the winter to make sure we get the most out of them for 2018 and the Wynd Community Garden is showing its first signs of colour.

We plan to carry out some additional planting in both gardens as we lost some of the plants due to the bad weather and the exposed locations
