- Plant snowdrops "in the green"
- Plant summer flowering bulbs
- Cut back Cornus (dogwood)
- · Refresh patio pots with fresh compost
- Lift and divide perennials
- Cut back grasses
- Feed roses and shrubs
- Sow hardy annuals
- Pot up dormant Dahlia tubers
- · Repair and feed your lawn
- Plan and design your garden
- Prepare trenches for runner beans
- · Sow Beetroot, Carrots, Swisschard, Lettuce, Peas
- Finish planting Shallot and Onion sets
- Divide pond, bog and marginal plants
